### NOTHING DOING.

City Council Has Session But Business Is Light.

At the regular adjourned meeting of the council on Monday evening, Mayor King in the chair, all members present. The usual coterie of legal lights from Portland was sadly missed; but the council managed to transact necessary business without them.

A communication was received from J. E. Brink, at Cathlamet, stating that in less than two weeks he would be on the ground here with the material for ferry approach work.

A communication from City Engineer W. W. Goodrich regarding the sewer district was read and slightly discussed. The proposed 8-inch sewer pipe for Jersey street was deemed insufficient; and it was finally thought best to postpone any action until Mr. Goodrich had been interviewed.

It was shown that the viewers appointed to appraise Gresham and Harriet streets had failed to do their duty—and W. L. Moxon, Charles Bruderson and W. L. Thorndyke were appointed in their stead. This committee was ordered to meet at city hall at eight o'clock on the morning of Tuesday, October 31—when they will be sworn in and transact the proper business.

J. B. Campbell was given a permit to anchor a boat house just above the public dock inside the piling. He desires to rent out boats—and will care for the dock during the life of his permit.

City Engineer Goodrich was ordered to make a plat of the waterfront showing all streets, vacated and in use; and Attorney Greene was instructed to assist in the compilation of the same.

City recorder was ordered to request the electric light company to put the lamps it furnishes into the condition called for by the franchise.

The accepted plans and specifications of sewers, heretofore accepted, were reconsidered—and the street committee will confer with the engineer regarding the size of pipes before the report is accepted.

Owing to illness of Recorder Hanks W. L. Thorndyke acted as recorder pro tem.  
Adjourned.
