#### Ordinance Authorizing The

ORDINANCE

Mayor And Recorder To Make A Contract For The Better Lighting Of The City Of St.

The City of St. Johns does ordain as

The mayor and city recorder of the City of St. Johns are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to enter into a contract in the name of said City of St. Johns with the Portland General Electric Company for the period of five years from and after this date for the placing and maintainance of eight additional alternating current enclosed are electric lights of fourteen hundred candle power each, at places heretofore agreed upon by the council of said city, to be paid for monthly at the rate of five and 20-100 dollars (\$5,30) per calender month for each of said are lamps, and in accordance with the terms of the contract heretofore submitted to the council of said city by said Portland General Electric Comany.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 67

An Ordinance Providing For The Appointment Of A Deputy Recorder For The City Of St. Johns, And Fixing His Compensation.

The City of St. Johns does ordain as

SECTION 1.—The Recorder of the City St. Johns is hereby authorized to appoint a Deputy City Recorder for the unexpired portion of his term of office, who shall have all the powers provided by the Charter of said City. SECTION 2.—The compensation of said
