A Matter of Local History

The Diary of James St. Johns Now Printed For The First Time.

Prepared by George H. Himes.

1841 June t.-Left here. Enamped on the banks of the Platte it two o'clock. Here we emamped. There came up a small foud, with the appearance of a light shower of rain. As it arose it e rain and hail came until the ound was covered with hail as rge as partridge eggs, and some our times as large. The rain eased a little while in the evening. art commenced again and rained nearly the whole night. The guards had a bad night for standing. 
