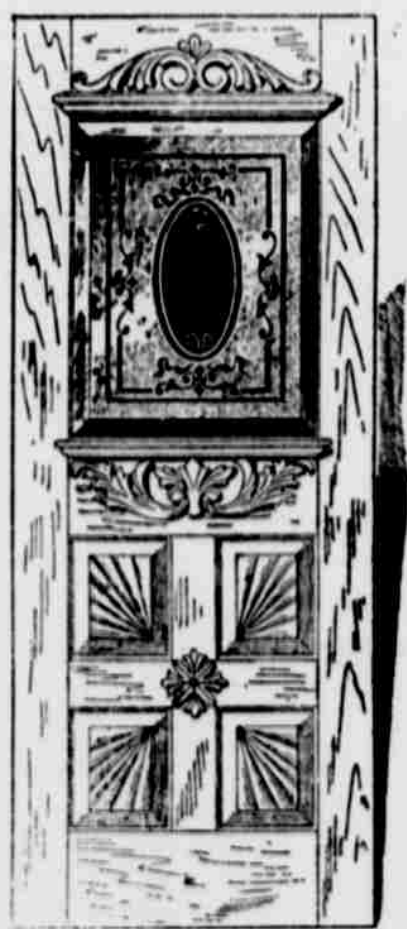

A FEW WORDS

On Woman Suffrage and the Benefits Derived.

The woman suffragists complain that women are "taxed without representation." This is a pet argument of the suffrage orator. Like many other arguments advanced by them investigation does not carry out the statement.

Women who own property (and when compared with the female population of this state those who own it in their own right) are very few. Taxes are of two kinds—a money tax and a service tax. The money tax is levied upon men as well as women property owners, and both reap the same benefits for it in the shape of police and fire protection, roads, light, water, etc. And this tax would always be levied upon both men and women alike who owned property. Besides the property tax there is the poll tax, which only men pay.

The service tax is levied upon men alone and consists of jury, police and military duty, which a woman cannot well perform.

For this service tax to which men are liable, representation is given. If representation to men were given on account of the money tax, how unfair it would be to give but one vote to the man who pays thousands in taxes, when one vote was granted the man who pays only a very small tax!

On the other hand, the rich man is only subject to the same service tax as the poor man. The service capacity of each for the safety of the municipality, state or nation is the same. They can only give a man's service. Each can handle only one musket in times of riot or invasion. Each can only protect the government in the same capacity. Hence the government, recognizing this service, grants to each individual the same say in its management.

It would be better for the people, for the suffragists and for the best interests of the state if such misleading statements were not made. Woman does not want to vote, and she does not want to mix up with politics in any way. Then why should the few demand what is not wanted by the many?

THE BONDS.

St. Johns Securities Very Attractive to Brokers.

With the municipal bonds of St. Johns commanding a higher premium than those of Seattle and other large and progressive cities a hundred times its size every property owner on the lower peninsula has something to feel proud of. As soon as the advertisement for bonds reached the proper channels it was evident that there would be keen competition for the securities. To bankers and brokers the bonds were an attractive proposition.

Up to 1 o'clock last Monday seven bids were received. Before the closing hour at 4 o'clock three more were handed in. The names of the bidders, the rate offered and the amount bid appears below:

It will be seen that Morris Bros. of Portland made the two best bids, with the Peninsula Bank of St. Johns second. It is very gratifying to all to know that the home institution was among the highest bidders and in order to secure the bonds the outside institutions had to exert themselves.

While the bid of \$1,101 at 6 per cent seems to be the best bid, their premium of \$301 at 5 per cent is the better one by a fraction of one-tenth of one per cent. But, by accepting the premium of \$1,101, or over 11 per cent of the bonds, the city has the immediate use of the money, and can, if it wishes, take the premium money and issue a new bond or transfer it to such fund as it sees fit.

PECULIAR

Is the Shape of Richmond Street Leading to the Dock.

At last the exact width of Richmond street has been officially determined. By examining all the records of transfers of the property City Engineer Goodrich has been able to make drawings for future use. The street is wedge-shaped. To be exact it is 70.4 feet wide at Jersey street and 75.44 at the river. The city dock extends six feet on private property on Richmond street and nine feet in the river. The fences on the north side of the street are all out of line, and Simmons' livery barn sets about 17 inches in the street. The measurements are taken from the old government monument at the corner of Richmond and Albany streets across at an angle to another monument 137.7 feet, near the bank of the river. The wedge shape is accounted for by the purchase of certain property by the late James Johns.

The survey is accurate and sets at rest all differences and controversies in regard to this particular thoroughfare.
