## THE BRIDGE.

A Start Made on Bridging the Willamette at St. Johns.

Work on the big \$2,000,000 railroad bridge across the Willamette at St. Johns is well under way. For the past week a pile-driver has been at work on the west side of the river driving huge piles for the temporary approach. The mess house for the employees is finished, and work on the other necessary buildings is under way. Large quantities of building material are being unloaded at the west side of the river that will be used in the construction of the bridge. Men are being engaged for the work and it will not be long before a force of several hundred workmen is employed. A major portion of the workmen will make their homes in St. Johns, and during the past week there have been many inquiries for houses to rent from those engaged in the work.
