COUNCIL

What Was Done at the Meeting Tuesday Night.

The council held a lengthy meeting Tuesday evening, devoting considerable time to uncompleted business. All members were present. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The St. Johns Ferry Co. asked for and were granted an extension of time in which to get their ferry boat to running.

Crook & Walton, who have the contract for the inside work on the new city hall, asked for an extension of time of ninety days in which to complete this work. Referred to building committee.

Several bills, aggregating \$979.15, including one of \$780 for the chemical engine, were allowed.

A letter from Architect Goodrich was read stating that work on the city hall should proceed. The contractors, Youngferdorf & Son, had stopped work and were not in the country.

It was ordered that the Fidelity Bonding Co., bondsmen of Youngferdorf & Son, be requested to safeguard the city against claims on the city hall, and that they be produced at the next meeting.

A license to sell intoxicating liquors was presented by and granted to J. E. Brink upon the presentation of the proper bonds.

No remonstrance having been made the improvements on Leavitt street were accepted.

A petition signed by twenty-four property owners, was presented asking for an are light at the corner of Ivanhoe and John street.

New street signs were ordered to be put in place.

On motion of Ald. Hewitt the bondsmen of the former city recorder were released from further responsibility.

On motion of Ald. Dobie the city engineer was ordered to furnish the field notes of all work done for the city.

Treasurer Hall submitted an itemized report of all money passing through his hands during the past year, and it was referred to the finance committee.

The body was recovered Saturday morning from where it had lodged directly under the air scow.

Mr. Walquist was a native of Bellingham, Wash., and for a year prior to his removal to this place he had made his home at Vancouver where he was employed on the bridge over the Columbia.

The deceased was a fine young man and was well liked by his fellow workmen. He had been a resident of St. Johns for about four months.

He was aged about 28 years. A young wife survives him.
