who invested in East St. Johns, purchasing a strip along the track near Maegley Junction for a site for their foundry and novelty iron works. It is their intention to begin improving their new purchase at once. The firm now employs thirty men, but when they move to their new location 100 workmen will be on the pay roll of the firm.

A Mr. Barnes, who is interested in the manufacture of woodenware, purchased an acre and a half north of Macrum avenue and fronting on the O. R. & N. track where a factory for the manufacture of woodenware will be erected. This company intends to begin operations that will require the services of fifty men.

Others are negotiating for factory sites in East St. Johns, and with the beginning of the huge packing plant and stock yards this locality promises to be one of the most densely populated districts in the city.
