Said curb to have a 4 inch tile drain every 50 feet. Said cement walk and curb to have expansion joints where directed by the city engineer.

All work and material to be according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said South Jersey street, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be "Local Improvement District No. 24."

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said South Jersey street is \$1637.90.

That the cost of said South Jersey street to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.

By grading same to the established grade by cut and fill; and by sidewalk same on both sides with 5 foot cement walks and 12 foot curb with necessary 5 foot wooden cross walks and box gutters. Said curb to have 4 inch tile drain every 50 feet, and curb and cement walk to have expansion joints when directed by the city engineer, between Polk and Burr streets. Also by placing a strip of macadam in center of said street between Polk and Burr streets. Said macadam to be 8 inches in center, 6 inches on either side, and to conform to Sec. 1 of Ordinance No. 192. That whereas, the city engineer has filed his report, plat and survey in the matter of opening, widening and extending Fessenden street in the city of St. Johns, as shown by said report, plat and survey on file in the office of the city recorder and hereby referred to, and

Whereas, said report, was by ordinance, adopted embodying the same on the 25th day of May, 1909, designated as Ordinance No. 236 of the city of St. Johns, hereby referred to and made a part of this resolution:

Now therefore, it is hereby resolved that L. B. Chipman, S. C. Norton and Gusert Goodhue, each being disinterested freeholders in the city of St. Johns and over the age of twenty years and not being related to the parties interested in such proposed widening, opening and extending of said Fessenden street and each possessing the qualifications of Jurors of the Circuit Court of Multnomah County, Oregon, be, and they and each of them are hereby appointed as Jurors to view such proposed opening, widening and extending of said Fessenden street as shown in said report, plat and survey and to assess damages and benefits caused by such changes so made and that the said L. B. Chipman, S. C. Norton and Gilbert Goodhue as such viewers, shall meet at the office of the city recorder in the city of St. Johns on the 30th day of June, 1909, at 2:30 p. m. of said day and shall then and there be sworn to faithfully discharge such duties as shall be assigned them.
