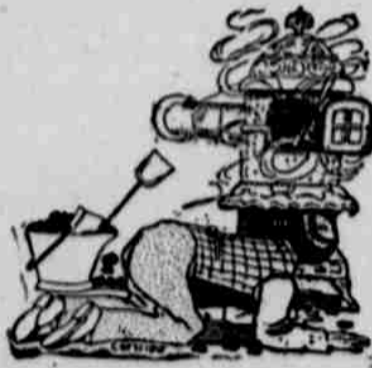

J. J. Axtell and wife of Deep River, Iowa, departed for their home Tuesday morning, after a two months' tour of the Pacific Coast. Mrs. Axtell is a sister of Mrs. W. H. King of this city, and several days were spent in visiting with her here. Both Mr. and Mrs. Axtell were highly pleased with St. Johns.

Since the Gas Company has filled in the ditches of its pipe lines on the different streets, this city presents a less war-like appearance. Three weeks ago a stranger would be inclined to believe that St. Johns was in a state of siege upon viewing the thrown-up entrenchments about the city.

The most interesting meeting of the year was held by the Commercial club Wednesday evening. The attendance was much larger than usual, and a vim and snap was evinced that was particularly pleasing. The matter of local freight was taken up and the secretary reported that prospects were exceedingly bright for the early installation of this service and that the rates would likely be from 7 to 10 cents per cwt from Portland. The annexation topic was discussed and the members present were emphatically opposed to such an unholy alliance at this time. Several energetic talks were made on the subject and also on cleanliness of the city. A waiting room and lavatory was projected to be placed on the vacant space on Jersey at Burlington street. The gas company offered to place 60 lights on Jersey street \$2 each per month—less than cost. Other matters of special interest were discussed, but lack of space forbids going into details this week.

E. W. Robison, a former resident of this city, died at Witch-Hazel, Washington county, Ore., October 13th, aged 56 years. Mr. Robison was a native of Michigan and had resided in Oregon for the past five years, most of which time was spent in Oregon. A wife and two daughters survive. Funeral services will be held in the Evangelical church Sunday afternoon at 1:30 under the auspices of the I. O. O. F., of which order Mr. Robison was a member.

By grace of the Supreme Court in a decision handed down Tuesday Sam Cochran was permitted to continue the sale of liquor in St. Johns. By this ruling of the highest tribunal in the state, the local option law has no force whatever in so far as St. Johns is concerned. The power of granting licenses is invested again in the city council, and the people can act only thro' it and its will in the premises is supreme. The decision coincides with that of City Attorney Collier made to council several months ago. His decision at the time was the subject of much averse criticism and he has good reason for feeling highly elated over the confirmation of his judgment by the supreme court. More licenses will likely be granted next week.
