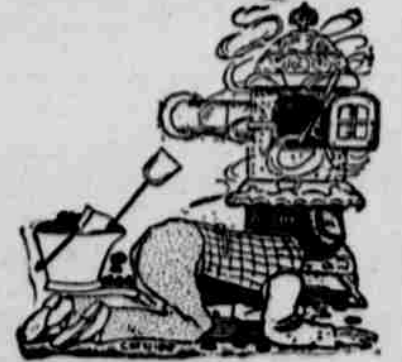

Geo. H. Camping, the hustling and energetic plasterer, has returned from a six weeks' sojourn at Salem, where he was engaged in making the insane asylum more habitable for the inmates. He says there is an awful crazy bunch confined within the institution.

That the Czar of Russia will have a royal orchard in Southern Oregon is the information given out by two nobles of his court, Anton Petroskevich and Peter Peterhof, who have just completed an inspection of the Pacific Northwest to locate such an orchard. They decided to recommend the Rogue River Valley and are expected to close negotiations just made for a tract near Medford.

Wagonloads of trout were taken from the Hermiston, Oregon, ditches when the water was turned off at the close of the season, thus indicating that the Government fish screens are ineffective. Every family in the settlement was well supplied with trout as a result of the big "catch," and because meat markets sold the fish out of season the proprietors were fined \$25 each. Many of the farmers who found the fish in their own ditches salted down the trout for future use.
