How is the money expended? What are the receipts, and how and from what source are they derived?

Section 64, subdivision 12 of the city charter is very plain on the subject. It

"The recorder shall make quarterly statements to the council, showing the receipts and disbursements, and the state of each particular fund at the close of business on the 15th day of March, the 15th day of June, the 15th day of September and the 15th day of December and also in detail, of the financial receipts penditures of the city, for all purposes, ogether with a detailed statement of the debt of said city, of the purposes for which said debt has been incurred, and of the property of said city, and of the accounts of said city with grantees of franchises, and also showing all franchis es then in effect, and the purposes for which said franchises were granted and the names of the present owners of such franchises, and said report shall be published in the city official paper at least

Would any business man permit his affairs to be conducted in a like manner, and if he did how long would it be before he would be a bankrupt? It has been told me that there are yet unsettled claims against the city hall. I would like to know what the recorder's and city engineer's offices cost per year.

What does the police department cost? What does the fire department cost? How much back salary Councilman Dobie and other councilmen have coming? How much is due viewers? and a number of other questions too numerous to mention in thisarticle. All of which would be unnecessary if the council would run the city business in conformity with the

Is the council afraid of being criticized, or, why do they not publish such
