The Buddhists contend that it was not Adam, but Buddha himself that made the footprint in the rock, that being the last dans and Chinese, agree that Samanala is a very holy place, and to perform a pligrimage to the spot is to the Buddhist what a visit to Mecca is to a Mohammedan. In mixed crowds the worshipers come, each pitying the ignorance of the other, who is so far from the "true way."

It requires no little faith and some imagination to trace in the depression in the rock the likeness of a buman footprint. It is 51/4 feet long by 21/4 feet wide, on the top of a huge bowl der. Tiny Lakes, Trees and Houses In Diminutive Japanese Parks.
