Mrs. Andy Wilson of Independence is visiting at the home of her daughter, Mrs. E. A. Simmons, 726 Oswego street.

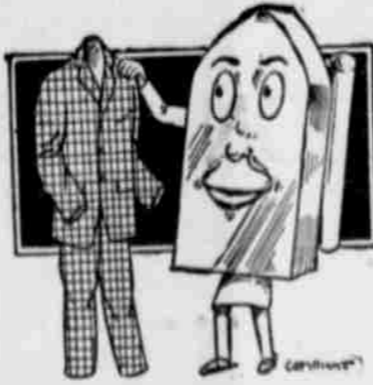
