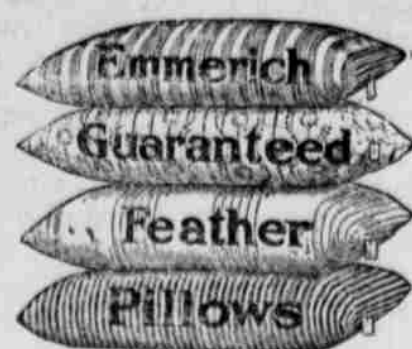

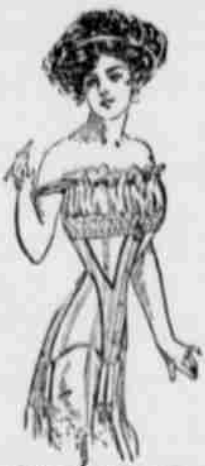

Notice to Contractors

At a meeting of the Jersey street property owners on December 22, 1910, the city council of the city of St. Johns was requested to call for bids for the several kinds of hard surface paving company. Each hard surface paving company is hereby invited to submit bids together with their general proposition as to price per square yard, quality, guarantee, etc., for the 13 blocks on Jersey street. Improvement to be made as soon in the spring as is practical. Bids to be opened in open meeting of the Jersey street property owners on February 23, 1911. These bids are asked for in order that each company shall have an equal opportunity to compete and to present their particular kind of pavement, also that the property owners may be better enabled to decide, price, quality and guarantee to be considered. It is understood that the bid of the company that may be accepted by the property owners shall not exceed the bid sent in to the February 23rd meeting, when the same may be taken through the council in the regular manner.
