RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the City of St. Johns: That it deems it necessary and expedient to improve Philadelphia street from the northwesterly line of Hayes street to the intersection with Jersey street, in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to-wit: By grading said portion of street to grade or subgrade now established, and by laying Bitulithic Pavement from curb to curb, the entire length thereof.

Work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and is hereby declared to be all of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said Philadelphia St. from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be local improvement district No. 65.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable cost of said improvement of said street is \$7,803.13.

That the cost of said Philadelphia St. improvement be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.

RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns: That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Charleston street from the center line of Hayes street to the southwesterly line of Olympia street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to-wit: By grading said portion of street to grade or subgrade to be established, and by laying a 6 foot cement walk and 12 foot curb from Hudson to Olympia streets, together with necessary cement cross walks and corrugated iron gutters at any point between Hayes and said Olympia streets, and by placing a strip of macadam in the center of the said street the entire length of said improvement, said macadam to be 8 inches deep in center and 6 inches deep at each edge, according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said Charleston street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be Local Improvement District No. 66.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$12,454.00.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.
