RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns, Oregon: That whereas, said city did on the 16th day of March, 1911, enter into a contract with one L. Seybold, wherein and where-by said L. Seybold did contract and agree to build and construct for said city a sewer system to be known as the "Maple Street Sewer" and has been officially designated as "Sewer District No. 2," that pursuant to said contract and agreement the said contractor did construct said sewer system so named and numbered; that the city engineer did file his official acceptance of said work on the 15th day of June, 1911, that said official acceptance was thereafter duly approved by the city sewer inspector and by the street committee of the city council of said city, and thereafter and on the 27th day of June, 1911, the said acceptance was regularly approved by the council of said city. That there being objections raised by interested parties to the aforesaid proceedings, wherefore be it further resolved, that to cover possible contingencies of defective workmanship or material used in the construction of said sewer system, the contractor aforesaid, in consideration of avoiding litigation by and with the parties interested as aforesaid, when the contractor shall have filed with the city recorder of said city a duly executed contract binding himself to keep and maintain said sewer system in good order and repair, and to fill up all street surfaces cut up in construction of said sewer for a term of TWO years from and after July 10, 1911; and has also filed with said recorder a good and sufficient bond in the penal sum of Five Thousand dollars, to be approved by the mayor of said city, guaranteeing all the conditions of said contract of maintenance, then the recorder of said city be and he is hereby ordered and directed to deliver all such warrant or warrants as may be due said contractor on account of said work.

RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns, Oregon: That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Charleston street from the center line of Hayes street to the southerly line of Olympia street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit: By grading said portion of street to grade or subgrade to be established, and by laying a 6 foot cement walk and 12 foot curb from Hudson to Olympia streets, together with necessary cement cross walks and corrugated iron gutters at any point between Hayes and said Olympia streets, and by placing a strip of macadam in the center of the said street the entire length of said improvement, said macadam to be 8 inches deep in center and 6 inches deep at each edge, according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said Charleston street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be Local Improvement District No. 66.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$12,454.00.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns, adopted the 29th day of June, 1911.
