**RESOLUTION**

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns that it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Columbia boulevard from the west line of Richmond street to the west line of Mohawk street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit: By grading said portion of street to grade or subgrade to be established, and by laying a 6 foot cement walk and 12 foot curb on each side of the said street, together with necessary corrugated iron gutters and cement crosswalks, and by placing a strip of macadam 16 feet wide in the center of the said street the entire length of said improvement, said macadam to be 8 inches deep in center and 6 inches deep at each edge, except where the tracks of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company lay in the center of said street, on which portion said macadam to be 10 feet wide on each side of said track and to be eight inches deep throughout same, according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land hereinafter described, and improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said Columbia boulevard, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be Local Improvement District No. 67.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$5,939.85.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns, adopted the 25th day of July, 1911.
