Opening Monday morning, Aug. 28th, there will be an exhibition of model aeroplanes in the St. Johns reading room. This will give ample time for preparation of exhibits. All boys who are interested, even if they have never tried their hand at the building of models, are urged to enter. Any model, however simple, or of whatever material will be welcome. In the library there are now the following books on the subject, which will be found useful:

Collins—"Boys' books of model aeroplanes."
Twining—Model aeroplanes.
Walker—Practical kites and aeroplanes.
Delecombe—Boys' book of airships.

Aston—Model flying machines.
Marshall—Flying machines, past, present and future.
Ferris—How it flies.

The three first named give actual plans and directions for the making, the others will help by giving a better general understanding of the principles of the air ship. Valuable hints will also be found in the periodicals—Popular Mechanics and Scientific American.

Each boy may enter as many models as he wishes. It is desired that all who expect to exhibit call at the library and enter their names within the next few days so that it may be known how many models may be expected.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the recorder of the city of St. Johns, until August 13th, 1911, at 8 o'clock p. m. for the improvement of Burlington street with standard Bitulithic pavement from the southerly side line of North Hayes street to the intersection with Philadelphia street in the manner provided by ordinance No. 407, subject to the provisions of the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns and the estimate of the city engineer on file. Engineer's estimate is \$3,792.50.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the City Recorder of the City of St. Johns until Aug. 18, 1911, at 8 o'clock p. m. for the improvement of Baltimore street from the westerly line of Edison street to the easterly line of Edison street, in the manner provided by Ordinance No. 402, according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file at the office of the city recorder and subject to the provisions of the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and the estimate of the city engineer, on file.

The engineer's estimated cost of same is \$4,212.70. Bids must be strictly in accordance with printed blanks which will be furnished on application at the office of the Recorder of the city of St. Johns. And said improvement must be completed on or before 60 days from the date of the signing of the contract by the parties thereto.

No proposals or bids will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the order of the mayor of the city of St. Johns, certified by a responsible bank for an amount equal to ten per cent. of the aggregate proposal, to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into contract and provide a suitable bond for the faithful performance of said work in the event the contract is awarded him.
