ORDINANCE NO. 441

An Ordinance Declaring the Cost of Improving Macrum Avenue, or that Portion Thereof, Lying and Being Between Columbia Slough and the Right of Way of the O. W. R. & N. Co.'s Right of Way, and Assessing the Property Benefitted Thereby, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Lists.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows: That the council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Macrum avenue, or that portion thereof lying and being between the Columbia Slough and the right of way of the Oregon-Washington Railway & Navigation Co.'s right of way, and all objection made thereto, and hereby ascertainment, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in manner provided by Ordinance No. 354 to be the sum of \$5,438.88, and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district, by reason of said improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the following annexed assessment roll, and said assessment roll, which is numbered 64, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the recorder of the city of St. Johns is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of city lists, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter, which assessment is as follows:
