ORDINANCE NO. 440

An Ordinance Declaring the Cost of Improving Philadelphia Street, or that Portion Lying and Being Between the Northerly Line of Edison Street and the Southerly Line of Hayes Street in the City of St. Johns, and Assessing the Property Benefited Thereby, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Liens.

The city of St. Johns does obtain as follows:

That the council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Philadelphia street, or that portion thereof lying between the northerly line of Edison street and the southerly line of Hayes street, in the city of St. Johns, and all objections made thereto, and hereby certifies, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in manner provided by Ordinance No. 139 to be the sum of \$5,961.87, and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district, by reason of said improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the following annexed assessment roll and said assessment roll, which is numbered 93, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the recorder of the city of St. Johns is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of city liens, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter, which assessment is as follows:
