ORDINANCE NO. 442

An Ordinance to Amend Section Five of Ordinance No. 206, Entitled "An Ordinance to License, Tax, Regulate and Restrain Bar Keepers, Saloon Keepers and Dealers in Spiritous, Vinous or Malt Liquors, Bar Rooms, Drinking Shops or Places Where Spiritous, Vinous or Malt Liquors are Kept for Sale or in Any Manner Disposed of and the Disposal Thereof; and Restricting the Places Where Said Liquors Can Be Sold; and Repealing Ordinance No. 65 Passed by the Council February 6th, 1906, Approved by the Mayor February 8th, 1906, and Ordinance No. 392, Passed by the Council and Approved by the Mayor June 7, 1911.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section Five (5) of Ordinance No. 206 of the City of St. Johns, Oregon, entitled "An Ordinance to License, Tax, Regulate and Restrain Bar Keepers, Saloon Keepers and Dealers in Spiritous, Vinous or Malt Liquors, Bar Rooms, Drinking Shops or Places Where Spiritous, Vinous or Malt Liquors are Kept for Sale or in Any Manner Disposed of and the Disposal Thereof; and Restricting the Places Where Said Liquors Can Be Sold; and Repealing Ordinance No. 65, Passed by the Council Feb. 6th, 1906, and Approved by the Mayor Feb. 8th, 1906, and Ordinance No. 392, passed by the council and approved by the Mayor June 7th, 1911," be, and each of said ordinances are hereby repealed, and said Section Five (5) of said ordinance No. 206, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 5. Every person, firm or corporation to whom a license shall be issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall pay into the city treasury a license fee of Twelve Hundred (\$1200.00) Dollars per annum, to be paid in two installments of Six Hundred (\$600) Dollars each, in advance of the issue of said license on the first day of January and July of each year. And no license shall in any case be issued until the license fee for the ensuing six months be paid as herein provided. That all licenses as herein contemplated shall expire on the 30th day of June and 31st day of December of each year, and no such license shall in any event be issued for a less term than six months, nor for a less cash payment than the said Six Hundred (\$600) Dollars. That all renewals of such licenses shall be effected in the same manner as now in force governing issue of annual license.

Passed the council this 5th day of December, 1911.
