**ORDINANCE NO. 455**

**An Ordinance Declaring the Cost of Improving Baltimore Street Between Edison and Jersey Street in the City of St. Johns, Oregon, and Assessing the Property Benefited Thereby, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Liens.**

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

That the council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Baltimore street between Edison street and Jersey street, in the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and all objections thereto, and hereby certifies, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in manner provided by Ordinance No. 437 to be the sum of \$2,546.87, and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district, by reason of said improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the following annexed assessment roll and said assessment roll, which is numbered 74, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the recorder of the city of St. Johns is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of city liens, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter, which assessment is as follows:
