### ORDINANCE NO. 471

An Ordinance Declaring the Cost of Improving Newton Street Between Portland Boulevard and Bank Street in the City of St. Johns, Oregon, and Assessing the Property Benefited Thereby, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Liens.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

That the council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Newton street from the northerly line of Portland boulevard to the southerly line of Bank street, in the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and all objections made thereto, and hereby ascertains, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in manner provided by Ordinance No. 438 to be the sum of \$4,326.45, and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district, by reason of said improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the following annexed assessment roll, and said assessment roll, which is numbered 75, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the recorder of the city of St. Johns is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of city liens, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter, which assessment is as follows:

### ORDINANCE NO. 472

An Ordinance Appropriating From the General Fund of the City of St. Johns Money to Pay the Excess Cost of Columbia Boulevard Over and Above the Amount Lawfully Assessable to the Property Benefited.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That there be and hereby is appropriated out of the General Fund of the city, not otherwise appropriated, so much money as shall be required to pay the excess cost of the improvement of Columbia boulevard, being that portion lying between Richmond street and Mohawk street, over and above the amount lawfully assessable to the property benefited by said improvement, as per Ordinance 457, not to exceed the amount of one hundred and eighty-two and 34/100 (\$182.34) dollars, face value of unremitted warrants issued for said improvement and accrued interest thereon to the amount of two and 14/100 (\$2.14) dollars.

Passed by the council this 23d day of April, 1912.
