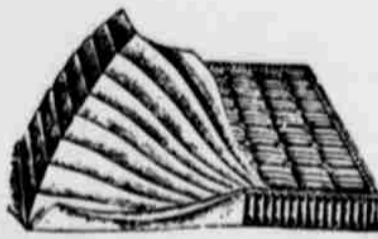

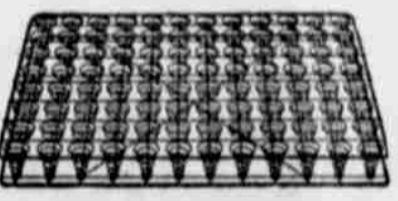

RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns: That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Burlington street from the northeasterly line of Bradford street to the center of Block 29, James Johns Second Addition to the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit: By grading the said street to the established subgrade, and paving the same with standard concrete pavement six inches thick from curb to curb, and by laying a six-foot cement walk on either side of same, curb to be twelve feet from the property line.

Said work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved.

Said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to the said Burlington street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be local improvement district No. 86.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$14,112.14.

That the cost of said improvement is to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns. Each front foot to bear its equal proportion of the cost of this improvement. Adopted the twenty-eighth day of May, 1912.

It is resolved by the City of St. Johns: That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve South Hayes street from the southerly line of Buchanan street to the northerly line of Ida street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By grading the said street to the established grade, and by laying six foot cement sidewalks and twelve foot curbs on both sides of said street with the necessary cement crosswalks and corrugated iron gutters.

Work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said S. Hayes Street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be local improvement district No. 86.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$3,746.55.

That the cost of said Central avenue improvement is to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.
