### RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the City of St. Johns, Oregon, that it deems it necessary and expedient to improve Polk street from the northeasterly side line of Willamette boulevard to the southwesterly side line of Jersey street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By macadamizing same from curb to curb with No. 2 rock, same to be six inches thick after being rolled.

Work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said Polk Street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be local improvement district No. 35.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$666.25.

That the cost of said Polk street improvement is to be assessed against the property in said local improvement district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.

### RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns, Oregon, that it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Ivanhoe street from the southerly line of Polk street to the northerly line of Ida street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By laying six foot cement sidewalk with fourteen foot curb and necessary cement crosswalk and iron gutters.

Said work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved.

Said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to the said Ivanhoe street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be Local Improvement District No. 34.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$5,642.01.

That the cost of said improvement is to be assessed against the property in said local improvement district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.

### RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns, Oregon,

that it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Burlington street from the northeasterly line of Bradford street to the center of Block 29, James Jones Second Addition to the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By grading the said street to the established subgrade, and paving the same with standard concrete pavement six inches thick from curb to curb, and by laying a six-foot cement walk on either side of same, curb to be twelve feet from the property line.

Said work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said Burlington street, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district is hereby declared to be "Local Improvement District No. 32."

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$14,112.14.

That the cost of said street is to be assessed against the property in said local improvement district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns. Each front foot to bear its equal proportion of the cost of this improvement.
