ORDINANCE NO. 482

An Ordinance Providing the Time and Manner of Improving Olympia Street from Myers Street to Charleston Street in the City of St. Johns, Oregon.

The city of St. Johns does obtain as follows:

The council of the city of St. Johns, having ascertained the cost of improving Olympia street from the northeasterly side line of Myers to the easterly side line of Charleston street in the city of St. Johns, Ore., as shown by the resolution of the council of said city, dated on 28th day of May, 1912, and recorded in the office of the recorder of said city, and notice thereof having been published in the St. Johns Review, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, on the 31st day of May and the 7th day of June, 1912, as shown by the affidavit of the foreman of said paper, which said affidavit is on file in the office of the city recorder, and legal posting of notice of such improvement, as shown by the affidavit of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder; and no remonstrances having been filed, and as provided by the said resolution, the engineer's preliminary estimate of said improvement is \$1,948.47, but shall be more accurately determined by said engineer.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered that said street be improved and the time for the completion of said improvement is hereby fixed at sixty days from the last publication of proposals of said work, which said proposals must be filed with the recorder of said city on or before the 9th day of July, 1912, at 8 o'clock, p. m. of said day.

That said street shall be improved as follows: By grading same to the established grade by cut and fill and by sidewalk same on either side with foot cement sidewalks and curbs entire length, together with all necessary cement crosswalks and corrugated iron gutters, curb to have three-inch drains the every fifty feet; hitch rings to be placed in the curb as directed by the city engineer.

The city recorder shall give notice by publication for not less than three insertions in the St. Johns Review, the official newspaper, inviting proposals for making said improvement.

Said improvement shall in all respects be done and completed in conformity with the provisions of Ordinance Nos. 150 and 302, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance; all work to be done under the direction and supervision of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement shall be assessed against the property in the local improvement district as described in said resolution and designated as and declared to be Local Improvement District No. 53.

Proposals for Street Work

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the Recorder of the City of St. Johns until July 2nd, 1912, at 8 o'clock p. m., for the improvement of Central ave. from the northeasterly line of St. Johns ave. to the southeasterly line of Bruce street in the manner provided by ordinance No. 480, subject to the provisions of the charter and ordinances of the City of St. Johns, and the estimate of the city engineer, on file.

Engineer's estimate is \$6,828.48. Bids must be strictly in accordance with printed blanks, which will be furnished on application at the office of the Recorder of the City of St. Johns. And said improvement must be completed on or before 60 days from date of the last publication of notice of proposals of said work.

No proposals or bids will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the order of the Mayor of the City of St. Johns, certified by a responsible bank for an amount equal to ten per cent. of the aggregate proposal.

RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns: That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Hartman street from the easterly line of Central avenue to the westerly line of Myers street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By grading said portion of street to grade to be established according to profile filed by the city engineer in the office of the city recorder June 10, 1912, by laying six-foot cement sidewalks and twelve foot curb on both sides of said street, with necessary cement crosswalks and corrugated iron gutters.

Said work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved.

Said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to the said Hartman street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be Local Improvement District No. 57.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$5,025.22.

That the cost of said improvement is to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns, except that each front foot shall bear its pro-rata of said assessment instead of the cost of improvement immediately in front of it, as provided by the city charter.
