For the first time in its history the famous battleship Oregon is to visit its own state. During the Elks reunion, in July, the historic old fighting ship will be brought to Portland harbor, where it will be much admired by all loyal Oregonians. Naval officials have at last given their consent to the request that the Oregon be brought here.

It may be that the American people will some day realize what a gigantic farce the delegate system of nominating presidents is getting to be. The affair at Chicago last week gave good illustraion of what can be expected from this system. The great majority of Republicans favored the nomination of Roosevelt, yet he had no show of nomi nation. It is time that the delegate system be abolished, and nominations be made direct by the people. The popular vote should be accorded the nomination in every instance. Perhaps the day will come when it will be so, especially after a few more burlesques like the Chicago convention.

One could not help but wonder, as he viewed the beautiful battleship, Maryland, recently lying in the Portland harbor, and costing a million or more dollars, why in this enlightened age it was necessary to construct such engines of war, and maintain in idleness and uselessness thousands of marines. But millions upon millions of dollars are spent toes. This would be all right pronecessary absolutely. We believe it possible to form an alliance between all nations whereby any international troubles may be satisfactorily settled by arbitration. Surely it is time that wars should cease, and no country be permitted, by international agreement, to maintain either navies or standing


