**ORDINANCE NO. 509**

An Ordinance Declaring the Cost of Improving Fessenden Street from the Westerly Side Line of Buchanan Street to the Westerly Side Line of Oswego Street, in the City of St. Johns, Oregon, and Assessing the Property Benefited Thereby, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Liens.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows: That the council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Fessenden street from the westerly side line of Buchanan street to the westerly side line of Oswego street in the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and all objections made thereto, and hereby ascertains, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in manner provided by Ordinance No. 475 to be the sum of \$7,498.67, and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district, by reason of said improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the following annexed assessment roll, and said assessment roll, which is numbered 84, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the recorder of the city of St. Johns is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of city liens, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter, which assessment is as follows:

Notice is hereby given that the assessment for the improvement of Fessenden street from Buchanan street to Oswego street, the total cost of which is \$7,498.67, was declared by Ordinance No. 509, entitled "An ordinance declaring the cost of improving Fessenden street from the westerly side line of Buchanan street to the westerly side line of Oswego street in the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and assessing the property benefited thereby, declaring such assessment and directing the entry of the same in the docket of city liens." The cost of said improvement is levied upon all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land within the boundaries of the district, as follows: Between the westerly side line of Buchanan street and the westerly side line of Oswego street. A statement of said assessment has been entered in the docket of city liens October 9, 1912, and said assessment is now due and payable at the office of the recorder of the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and will be delinquent and bear interest after October 19, 1912, and if not paid on or before November 9, 1912, proceedings will be taken for the collection of the same by sale of property as provided by the city charter.
