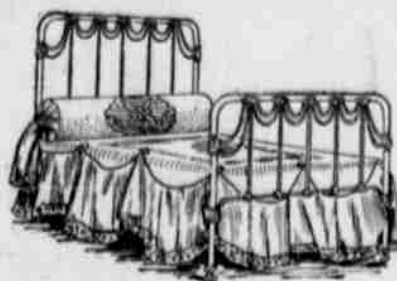

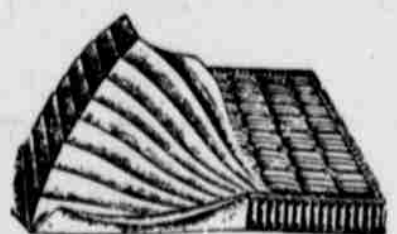

A beautiful Iron Bed like cut \$4.50

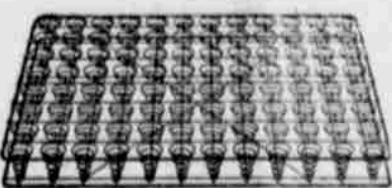
