### ORDINANCE NO. 519

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE GRADE OF CRAWFORD STREET IN THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS, OREGON, BETWEEN RICHMOND STREET AND POLK STREET AND ADOPTING THE PROFILE MAP AND PLAT OF THE CITY ENGINEER.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

That the grade of Crawford street between Richmond street and Polk street as now located and established be and the same is hereby established according to the profile map of the City Engineer on file in the office of the City Recorder, which said profile map establishes the grade on the basis of the city monuments and "datum" plane of the City of St. Johns, Oregon, and which said profile has been examined and is hereby approved, and the grade of the said street is hereby established in conformity with said map, which said map is entitled "Profile Map for Crawford Street" and is dated December 17, 1912, and is signed by C. E. Andrew, City Engineer.

### ORDINANCE NO. 520

An Ordinance Declaring the Cost of Improving Burlington Street from the Northeastern Side Line of Bradford Street to the Center Line of Block 29, James John Second Addition in the City of St. Johns, Oregon, and Assessing the Property Benefited Thereby, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Liens.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

That the council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Burlington St. from the northeastern side line of Bradford St. to the center line of Block 29, James John 2nd addition in the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and all objections made thereto, and hereby certifies, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in manner provided by Ordinance No. 484 to be the sum of \$10,380.18 and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district, by reason of said improvement, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the following annexed assessment roll and said assessment roll, which is numbered 89, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the recorder of the city of St. Johns is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of city liens, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter, which assessment is as follows:
