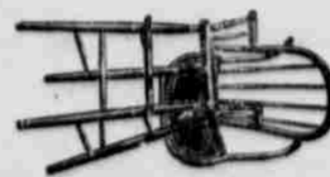

Rev. C. P. Gates and family spent Christmas week with relatives and friends in St. Johns. He is the same energetic and optimistic good fellow as of yore.

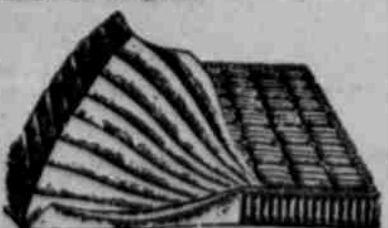
G. D. Fassett, who has been in San Francisco for the past several months, spent Christmas week with his family here, returning to Frisco via the Beaver Tuesday.
