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Given Away Saturday

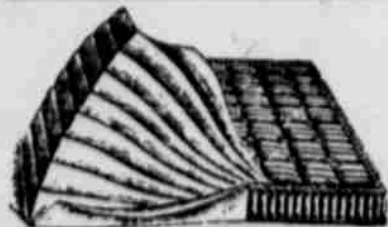
The drawing of \$50 worth of chocolates at the Bungalow store will take place tomorrow, Saturday, at 8 P. M.
