#### RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns,

Oregon: That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Willamette boulevard a from its easterly termination at the North and street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By grading said street to the established grade or grade to be established by laying a six foot cement sidewalk on by laying a six foot cement sidewalk on both sides of said street, by laying ce-ment curbs, by laying a thirty foot gravel bitulithic pavement. Improve-ment to be made as follows: From North Bank bridge to Richmond street, the center line of sidewalk on north side of boulevard to be twenty three feet from property line on north side of said boulevard, the center line of said thirty foot pavement to be fifty feet from the property line on north side of boulevard, the center line of the splewalk on the south side of said street to be seventyseven feet south of the property line on the north side of said loulevard, reserving to the Council, should it so desire, the right to leave off stdewalks in front of such property as is not already represented upon the petitions filed herein for the improvement of said Williamette boulevard as above or as shall not hereafter within the proper time be rep-resented by agreements of owners to pay for said sidewalk and improvementa above upon the same terms and conditions as have been agreed by the owners

of said property in petitions now on file for the aforesaid improvement. Said work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said im-provements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervis-ionand direction of the city engineer,

That the cost of said improvement t assessed equally and in proportion improvement made adjacent and abutting each piece of property, and as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and par-ticularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termin) of such improve ments abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said street, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto. That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be "Local Improvement Dis-trict No. 95."

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improve-ment of said street is \$28,787.50. That the cost of said street is to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.


