Notice of Cost of Improvement

Notice is hereby given that the assessment for the improvement of Dawson street from Columbia boulevard to Ida street, the total cost of which is \$19,294.47 was declared by Ordinance No. 529, entitled "An ordinance declaring the cost of improving Dawson street from the southeasterly line of Columbia boulevard to the center line of Ida Street, in the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and assessing the property benefited thereby, declaring such assessment and directing the entry of the same in the docket of city taxes."

The cost of said improvement is levied upon all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land within the boundaries of the district, as follows: Between Columbia boulevard and Ida street. A statement of said assessment has been entered in the docket of city taxes February 5, 1913, and said assessment is now due and payable at the office of the recorder of the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and will be delinquent and bear interest after February 15, 1913, and if not paid on or before March 6th, 1913, proceedings will be taken for the collection of the same by sale of property as provided by the city charter.

RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the city of St. Johns, Oregon:

That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve Williams boulevard from easterly termination at the North Bank bridge to the easterly line of Richmond street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By grading said street to the established grade or grade to be established by laying a six foot cement sidewalk on both sides of said street, by laying cement curbs, by laying a thirty foot gravel bitulithic pavement. Improvement to be made as follows: From North Bank bridge to Richmond street, the center line of sidewalk on north side of boulevard to be twenty-three feet from property line on north side of said boulevard, the center line of said thirty foot pavement to be fifty feet from the property line on north side of boulevard, the center line of the sidewalk on the south side of said street to be seventy-seven feet south of the property line on the north side of said boulevard, reserving to the Council, should it so desire, the right to leave off sidewalks in front of such property as is not already represented upon the petitions filed herein for the improvement of said Williams boulevard as above or as shall not hereafter within the proper time be represented by agreements of owners to pay for said sidewalk and improvements above upon the same terms and conditions having been agreed by the owners of said property in petitions now on file for the aforesaid improvement.

Said work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed equally and in proportion to improvement made adjacent and abutting each piece of property, and as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said street, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be "Local Improvement District No. 96."

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$28,787.50.

That the cost of said street is to be assessed against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the city charter of the city of St. Johns.
