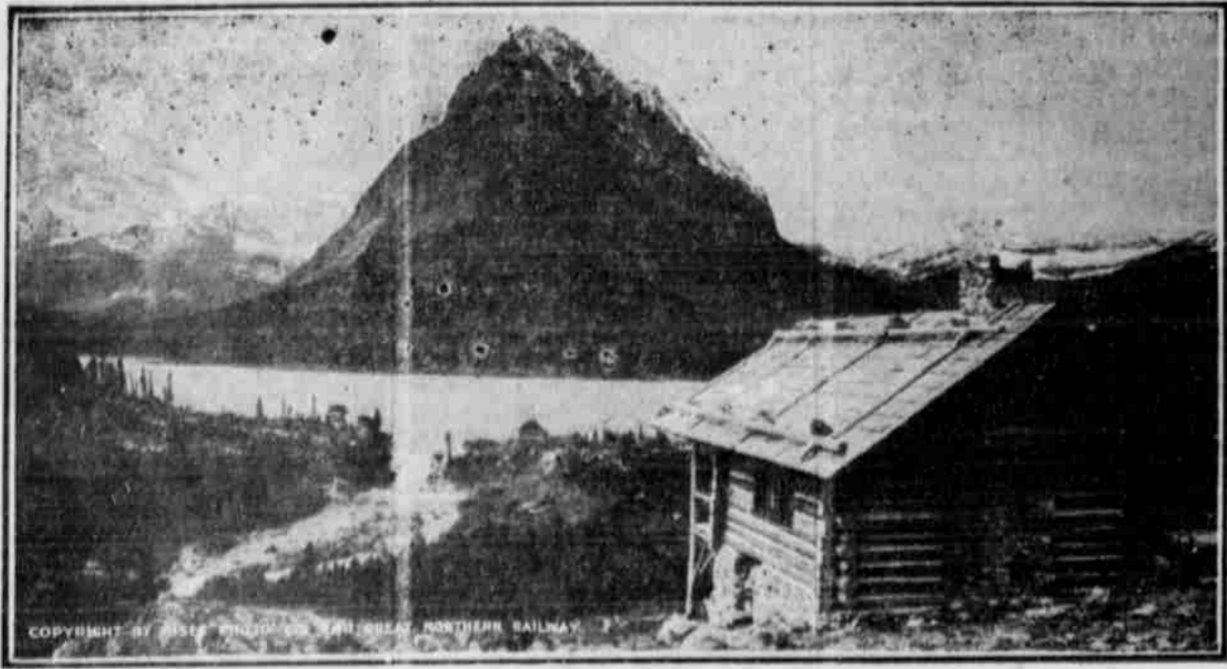


Nature Garbed Glacier National Park in all its Grandeur; Most Beautiful Words of English Language Describe It!

All the rest of the beautiful words in the English language could be used and still the word picture would not be adequate, artists say. Some of the best landscape painters in the country declare it is impossible even to do justice to the scenic beauty of Uncle Sam's new park. Many have tried with the brush but ever-changing hues from light effects are not to be reproduced in the Rocky Mountain fastnesses of Northwestern Montana.

S. Government in 1910-11-12, and good for twenty-eight (28) years from the issuance thereof, covering the subject-matter of said Bonville 99 Year System.

I, the said Frank Bonville, agree not to sell or assign or otherwise dispose of my interest in said copyrights, of which I am owner, during the life time of same. I further agree to remit to the said
