Mrs. Luella Downs Cornett, aged 37 years, and a sufferer from a complication of diseases, finally developing into paralysis, for several years, died Tuesday morning at the family home, 732 Allegheny street. Her suffering reached an acute stage more than a year ago, at which time she became blind. She has been confined to her bed since then. She was a daughter of the late Justice O. R. Downs. She is survived by her husband, mother, three brothers and two sisters. The funeral was held yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock, from the Blackburn undertaking parlors. Interment in the Columbia cemetery.

**RESOLUTION**

It is resolved by the City of St. Johns, Oregon:

That it seems it expedient and necessary to improve N. Leonard street from the north line of St. Johns avenue to the north line of City Limits in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:

By grading said portion of said street to grade or sub-grade to be established, and by laying a six foot cement sidewalk and twelve foot curb on both sides of said street with necessary crosswalks and gutters.

Work to be done according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed on a pro rata basis as provided by city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be of lots parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said street from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.

That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be Local Improvement district No. 98.

That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$5,698.80.

That the cost of said street be assessed on a pro rata basis against the property in said local assessment district as provided by the charter of the city of St. Johns.

Adopted by the council this 29th day of April, 1913.
