ORDINANCE NO. 542

An Ordinance Providing the Time and Manner of Improving Richmond Street from Smith Avenue to Fessenden Street in the City of St. Johns, Oregon.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows: The council of the city of St. Johns, having ascertained the cost of improving Richmond street from the north side line of Smith Avenue to the south side line of Fessenden street in the city of St. Johns, as shown by resolution of the council of said city, dated on the 6th day of May, 1913, and recorded in the office of the recorder of said city, and notice thereof having been published in the St. Johns Review, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, on the 9th and 16th days of May, 1913, as shown by the affidavit of the foreman of said jury, which said affidavit is on file in the office of the city recorder; and legal posting of notices of such improvement, as shown by the affidavit of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder, and no remonstrances having been filed, and as provided by said resolution, the engineer's preliminary estimate of cost of said improvement is \$2,861.80, but shall be more accurately determined by said engineer.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered that said street be improved and the time for the completion of said improvement be hereby fixed at 60 days from last publication of notice of proposals of said work, which said proposals must be filed with the recorder of said city on or before the 17th day of June, 1913, at 8 o'clock, p. m. of said day.

That said street shall be improved as follows: By grading same to the established grade by cut and fill and by sidewalking same on either side with 6 foot cement sidewalks, 12 foot cement curbs entire length, together with all necessary cement cross-walks and corrugated iron gutters; said walk and curb to have expansion joints as directed by the City Engineer; curb to have four-inch drain the every fifty feet, hitch rings to be placed in curb as directed by the City Engineer.

The city recorder shall give notice of publication for not less than three insertions in the St. Johns Review, the official newspaper, giving proposals for making said improvement.

Said improvement shall in all respects be done and completed in conformity with the provisions of Ordinances No. 160 and 362 except as otherwise provided in this ordinance; all work to be done under the direction and supervision of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement shall be assessed against the property in the local improvement district as described in said resolution and designated as and declared to be Local Improvement District No. 39.

Notice of Cost of Improvement

Notice is hereby given that the assessment for the improvement of Fessenden street from Jersey street to Smith avenue, the total cost of which is \$6,434.46, was declared by Ordinance No. 543, entitled "An ordinance declaring the cost of improving Fessenden street from the northerly line of Jersey street to the northerly line of Smith avenue, and assessing the property benefited thereby, declaring such assessment and directing the entry of the same in the docket of city liens." The cost of said improvement is levied upon all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land within the boundaries of the district described as follows: Between the northerly line of Jersey street and the northerly line of Smith Avenue. A statement of such assessment has been entered in the docket of city liens May 28, 1913, and said assessment is now due and payable at the office of the recorder of the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and will be delinquent and bear interest after June 7, 1913, and if not paid on or before June 27, 1913, proceedings will be taken for the collection of the same by sale of property as provided by the city charter.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the recorder of the city of St. Johns, until June 17, 1913, at 3 o'clock p. m. for the improvement of Richmond street from the north line of Smith Avenue, to the south line of Fessenden street in the manner provided by Ordinance Number 542, subject to the provisions of the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns and the estimate of the city engineer on file. Engineer's estimate is \$2,861.80. Bids must be strictly in accordance with the printed blanks, which will be furnished on application at the office of the recorder of the city of St. Johns. And said improvement must be completed on or before 60 days from the date of the last publication of this notice. No proposals will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the order of the mayor of the city of St. Johns, certified by a responsible bank for an amount equal to ten per cent. of the aggregate proposal. The right to reject any and all bids is hereby reserved.

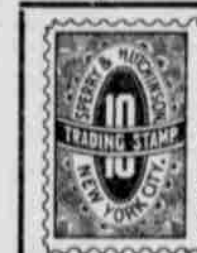
