

**ORDINANCE NO 590.**

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CERTAIN PROPOSITIONS TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS AT THE REGULAR ANNUAL CITY ELECTION HELD ON MONDAY, THE SIXTH DAY OF APRIL A. D. 1914. SHALL THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS INCUR A MUNICIPAL BONDED INDEBTEDNESS IN THE SUM OF NINE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$9,500.00) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING A TRIPLE COMBINATION AUTO TRUCK FIRE FIGHTING APPARATUS.

The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The City Council deems it expedient and necessary for the best interest of the city to acquire certain fire fighting apparatus, which the exigencies of the fire department requires. That as the regular annual city election will be held on Monday, the sixth day of April A. D., 1914; therefore it is ordered that a proposition to be submitted to the qualified electors of the city of St. Johns, namely as follows: "Shall the city of St. Johns incur a municipal bonded indebtedness in the sum of Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$9500.00) for the purchasing of a triple combination auto truck fire fighting apparatus?"

Section 2. That said Triple Combination Auto Truck shall be held and used by the city of St. Johns for fire protection. That said bonds to run for a period of Ten (10) years from the date of issue, and bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum, and interest to be paid semi-annually.

Section 3. It is, therefore, ordered that the City Recorder is authorized, directed and required to have said proposition printed upon the ballot, and have the required notice posted as required by law and the city charter of the city of St. Johns, and make all necessary arrangements to enable the qualified electors of the city of St. Johns to vote in the affirmative or in the negative on said proposition at the annual city election to be held as above stated.

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**ORDINANCE NO. 588**

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS, OREGON, FOR THE YEAR 1914.

The City of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the salary of the Mayor of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$3,000 for each regular meeting of the city council which he attends.

Section 2. That the salary of each Councilman of the city of St. Johns, excepting such Councilman as may be appointed as chairman of the street committee, be and the same is hereby fixed at \$2,000 for each regular meeting which he attends.

Section 3. That the salary of the member of the city council of the city of St. Johns, who shall be appointed chairman of the street committee be and the same is hereby fixed at \$3,000 for each regular meeting of the city council which he attends, while he is so acting as chairman of the street committee.

Section 4. That the salary of the City Recorder of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$100.00 per month.

Section 5. That the salary of the Deputy Recorder of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$50.00 per month.

Section 6. That the salary of the City Treasurer of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$50.00 per month.

Section 7. That the salary of the City Attorney of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 8. That the salary of the City Engineer of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$125.00 per month.

Section 9. That the salary of the Chief of Police of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$85.00 per month.

Section 10. That the salary of the Night Policemen of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 11. That the salary of each regular Assistant Police or Patrolman of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 12. That the salary of each Chainman of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 13. That the salary of each regular Assistant Engineer of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 14. That the salary of the City Janitor of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$50.00 per month.

Section 15. That the salary of the City Dock Watchman of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$10.00 per month.

Section 16. That the salary of the fireman or the employe to care for the city crematory of the city of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby fixed at \$10.00 per month.

Section 17. That this ordinance shall take effect and become operative on and after the 13th day of April, 1914.

All of said bonds are coupon bonds, bearing interest at the rate of six per cent, payable semi-annually, subject to all the conditions imposed, directed and stipulated by Section 131 of the charter of the City of St. Johns.

The right is reserved to redeem any and all bonds at any interest paying period at or after one year from date.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check for two per cent of the amount of the bid, and the said check shall be payable to the City of St. Johns, and the said check shall be retained by the City of St. Johns as damages in case the bidder to whom the bonds are awarded fails to accept and pay for the same within fifteen days after the acceptance of the bid.

The money is to be paid and the bonds are to be delivered at St. Johns, Multnomah county, Oregon.
