

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 156 OF THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS, AND FIXING THE MAXIMUM RATE TO BE CHARGED CONSUMERS FOR GAS WITHIN THE SAID CITY OF ST. JOHNS.

That Ordinance No. 156, the same being an ordinance grant-ing to the St. Johns Gas, Light and Heating Company, its successors in interest a franchise to furnish the City of St. Johns with gas and fixing a rate to charge therefor.

The City of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Ordinance No. 156 shall be, and is hereby, amended to read; That the maximum rate that may be charged for gas furnished consumers by the St. Johns Gas, Light and Heating Company within the City of St. Johns shall not exceed the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar per 1000 cubic feet, with a five per cent discount to consumers on quantities of gas less 25,000 cubic feet, if payment of bills are made on or before the 10th day of each month; on quantities of gas exceeding 25,000 cubic feet the rates of discount to be made as now granted and given consumers in the city of Portland, Oregon.

The gas company shall own all pipes from the gas main to the meter, where the consumer will make connections, and shall supply consumers of gas with ranges for each and every use at the actual cost of such ranges to the company, and said company shall also give the consumers of gas the privilege of purchasing such ranges upon payment of monthly installments. The gravity of the gas produced and furnished consumers shall be at least 565 B. T. units and of 24 candle power. Passed by the council this, the 26th day of May, A. D., 1914. "It is possible that capital has invited such action, but as a believer in organized labor and as a sincere friend of the man who works, The Sentinel believes that Oregon is inclined to travel a little too fast in this direction. We must not forget that with-

out employers there will be no employes. Oregon's laws are keeping capital out of the state and have made investment of money in dangerous industries exceedingly risky.
