We believe everybody in the United States will offer up a prayer on that day in the earnest spirit of altruism, which the President's message suggests. And if anything can make a path for peace "where men can see none," we believe unselfish supplication from the heart of a great country can open the door of divine compassion.—The Baltimore Sun.

We often wonder if it has ever occurred to some people that editors are human, and not gifted with second sight. An editor is constantly on the hunt for news of interest to the people who read and pay for his paper, and he never intentionally omits an article of any importance. The success of his paper depends upon his impartiality in this respect. And yet often some person conceives the erroneous idea that the editor has purposely left out some item concerning them or their families. Has it ever occurred to them that the editor may not have heard of that particular item, although he searched diligently in his efforts to secure all of the news? There is a very effective remedy for those isolated but inadvertent omissions. The next time you have a piece of news concerning yourself, or your family, or your neighbors, or of your community, give it to the editor yourself, or phone or write it in to him, and do not depend upon others to do it. They may be more interested in affairs on their own side of the fence. The editor will thank you for your thoughtfulness in enabling him to secure news that will add to the value of his paper and make it of interest to all of the people, for that is his mission in life.—Exchange.

**RESOLUTION**  
It is resolved by the city of St. Johns, Oregon:  
That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve St. Johns avenue, from the easterly side line of Edison street to the westerly side line of Seneca street in the city of St. Johns in the following manner, to wit:  
By grading said street to grade, and by laying a six foot cement sidewalk and fifteen foot curb on each side of said street with necessary crosswalks, according to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the city recorder relative thereto, which said plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.  
That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the terminal of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said street, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.  
That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be "Local Improvement District No. 117."  
That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$7,363.89.  
That the cost of said street is to be assessed against the property in said local improvement district as provided by the charter of the city of St. Johns.

**Notice of Cost of Improvement**  
Notice is hereby given that the assessment for the improvement of Willamette boulevard from Richmond street to Burlington St., the total cost of which is \$6,991.30 was declared by Ordinance No. 620, entitled "An ordinance declaring the cost of improving Willamette boulevard from the westerly side line of Richmond street to the easterly side line of Burlington street, in the city of St. Johns, Oregon, and assessing the property benefited thereby, declaring such assessment and directing the entry of the same in the docket of city liens."  
The cost of said improvement is levied upon all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land within the boundaries of the district, as follows: Between Richmond street and Burlington street.

**ORDINANCE NO. 620**  
An Ordinance Declaring the Cost of Improving Willamette Boulevard from the Westerly Side Line of Richmond Street to the Easterly Side Line of Burlington Street, in the City of St. Johns, Oregon, and Assessing the Property Benefited Thereby, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Liens.  
The city of St. Johns does ordain as follows:  
That the council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Willamette boulevard from the westerly side line of Richmond street to the easterly side line of Burlington street, and all objections made thereto, and hereby certifies, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in manner provided by Ordinance No. 600 to be the sum of \$6,991.30, and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district, by reason of said improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the following annexed assessment roll, and said assessment roll, which is numbered 111, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the recorder of the city of St. Johns is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of city liens, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter, which assessment is as follows:

**ORDINANCE NO. 621**  
An Ordinance for the Change of Grade on Charleston Street from East Side Line of Willamette Boulevard to West Side Line of Hayes Street in the City of St. Johns.  
Whereas, That on the 19th day of August, 1914, a petition signed by a majority of the property owners abutting upon and affected by the change of grade on Charleston street as aforesaid was filed herein authorizing the necessary change to be made in the grade on the said street.  
That on the 25th day of August, 1914, the City Council passed a resolution authorizing and directing the City Engineer to make and file a profile showing the proposed change of grade, and to post notices of said change as provided by the charter and ordinances of the City, setting forth in said notice the time in which objections or remonstrances may be made, and  
It appearing to the Council that the proceedings heretofore had are regular, and that due and legal notice of the said change has been legally and regularly made, and the time for remonstrances or objections thereto have expired, and that no objection or remonstrance has been made or filed against said change of grade; therefore,  
It is ordained by the City of St. Johns:  
That the grade heretofore established on Charleston street between the east side line of Willamette boulevard and the west side line of Hayes street in the City of St. Johns be, and the same is hereby, changed to conform to the plans, survey and profile made by J. O. Burson, City Engineer, now on file in the office of City Recorder of the City of St. Johns, Oregon.

Said improvements to be in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.  
That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the terminal of such improvements abutting upon adjacent or proximate to said street, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.  
That all the property included in said improvement district aforesaid is hereby declared to be "Local Improvement District No. 116."  
That the city engineer's assessment of the probable total cost of said improvement of said street is \$883.08.  
That the cost of said street to be assessed against the property in said local improvement district as provided by the charter of the City of St. Johns.
