

An Ordinance "Declaring the Cost of Abating Nuisance as Provided by Ordinance No. 607, Providing for the Cutting and Removing of Weeds, Grass and Noxious Vegetation and Assessing the Property, Chargeable Therewith [With the Costs Thereof, Declaring Such Assessment and Directing the Entry of the Same in the Docket of City Liens.

Section 1. That the Council has considered the proposed assessment for the necessary work, penalty and expense incurred for the abatement or removal of the nuisance above named, and all objection made thereto, and hereby ascertains, determines and declares the cost for the removal of the nuisance herein mentioned against each lot or part thereof or parcel of land chargeable therewith to be the sum of money set opposite the number of each of the lots or parts thereof or parcels of land in the annexed assessment roll, which is hereto attached and made a part hereof, and which is hereby adopted and approved as the true and correct sum of money assessed to each lot or part thereof or parcel of land therein contained, and the City Recorder of the City of St. Johns is hereby directed to enter the said sum of money set opposite each and every lot or part thereof, or parcel of land, as shown by the aforesaid assessment, against each of the said lots, or parts thereof, or parcels of land in the Docket of City Liens, and cause a notice thereof to be published as provided by the City Charter of St. Johns.
