ORDINANCE NO. 648.

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS, OREGON, FOR THE YEAR 1915.

The City of St. Johns does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the salary of the Mayor of the City of St. Johns, be and the same is hereby fixed at \$3.00 for each regular meeting of the City Council which he attends.

Section 2. That the salary of each Councilman of the City of St. Johns excepting such Councilmen as may be appointed as Chairman of the Street Committee, be and the same is hereby fixed at \$2.00 for each regular meeting of the City Council which he attends.

Section 3. That the salary of the member of the City Council of the City of St. Johns, who shall be appointed chairman of the Street Committee be and the same is hereby fixed at \$3.00 for each regular meeting of the City Council which he attends, while he is acting as Chairman of the Street Committee.

Section 4. That the salary of the City Recorder of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$100.00 per month.

Section 5. That the salary of the Deputy Recorder of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$50.00 per month.

Section 6. That the salary of the City Treasurer of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$50.00 per month.

Section 7. That the salary of the City Attorney of the City of St. Johns, be and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 8. That the salary of the City Engineer of the City of St. Johns be and the same is fixed at \$125.00 per month.

Section 9. That the salary of the Chief of Police of the City of St. Johns be and the same is fixed at \$85.00 per month.

Section 10. That the salary of the night policeman of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 11. That the salary of each regular assistant Police or Patrolman, of the City of St. Johns, be and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 12. That the salary of each chairman of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 13. That the salary of each regular assistant Engineer of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$75.00 per month.

Section 14. That the salary of the City dock Watchman of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$10.00 per month.

Section 15. That the salary of the Firemen or the employee to care for the City Crematory of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$10.00 per month.

Section 16. That the salaries of each of the two paid firemen of the City of St. Johns be and the same is hereby fixed at \$85.00 per month.

Section 17. That this Ordinance shall take effect and become operative on and after the 13th day of April, 1915.




