All the offices of the organization are on the same floor and the exhibit will be explained to visitors by a man thoroughly conversant with every detail. Any manufacturer in the state who desires to exhibit his goods should write to the manager of the Chamber of Commerce and arrangements for space will promptly be made. The organization will make every effort to induce buyers to select Oregon made goods in all cases where quality and price make it possible.

J. W. Brewer, who is in charge of the land and homeseekers' bureau of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, will start next Monday on a tour of several Oregon cities for the purpose of ascertaining what opportunities they present for new settlers and to cooperate with local commercial organizations in any movements for future development.


