As a result of a recent investigation, a committee has been appointed to take charge of the work and to extend to manufacturers any assistance they may request from the organization. An exhibit of Oregon-made goods has been installed on the main floor of the building occupied by the Portland Chamber of Commerce. All the offices of the organization are on the same floor and the exhibit will be explained to visitors by a man thoroughly conversant with every detail. Any manufacturer in the state who desires to exhibit his goods should write to the manager of the Chamber of Commerce and arrangements for space will promptly be made. The organization will make every effort to induce buyers to select Oregon-made goods in all cases where quality and price make it possible.

J. W. Brewer, who is in charge of the land and homesteaders' bureau of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, will start next Monday on a tour of several Oregon cities for the purpose of ascertaining what opportunities they present for new settlers and to cooperate with local commercial organizations in any movements for future development.

RESOLUTION

It is resolved by the City of St. Johns:

That it deems it expedient and necessary to improve South Ivanhoe street from the East line of Burlington street to the West line of Richmond street in the City of St. Johns in the following manner to wit:

By grading said portion of street to grade or subgrade to be established and by laying a 6 foot cement walk and 12 foot curb on both sides of said street, with necessary Wooden Cross-walk and Catch Basins.

According to the plans and specifications of the city engineer on file in the office of the City Recorder relative thereto, which said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory and are hereby approved. Said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of St. Johns, and under the supervision and direction of the city engineer.

That the cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property especially and particularly benefited thereby, and which is hereby declared to be all of lots, parts of lots, blocks and parcels of land between the termini of such improvements abutting upon, adjacent or proximate to said street, from the marginal lines of said street back to the center of the block or blocks or tracts of land abutting thereon or proximate thereto.
