The attention of G. M. Standifer and associates is respectfully directed to the Lower Peninsula as a superb site for the million dollar steel ship-building plant that they will establish within the next few days. Vancouver is fondly anticipating that the plant will be located there, but it has no edge on the peninsula as a location, viewed by any standpoint. The peninsula, however, is seriously handicapped in the race to secure other ship plants, because it does not have the band of boosters promoting its virtues as does the city of Vancouver. The Standifer Company has secured the contract for ten big steel ships that will cost approximately \$16,000,000.

No business man in any town should allow a newspaper published in his town to go without his name and business being mentioned somewhere in its columns, says an exchange. The life of any town depends upon the live, wideawake and liberal advertising business men.

A fact that should and undoubtedly will prove of vast material advantage to St. Johns was brought out quite clearly by Secretary Dotson of the Portland Chamber of Commerce when he spoke at the High School auditorium last week, and that is the fact that the Public Docks Commission has set aside sixty acres of land of the tract purchased in connection with the elevator site in North St. Johns for manufacturing purposes. This tract will be offered in portions of requisite size to industrial concerns, upon a very low rental basis and to be used so long as the land is utilized for which it is acquired. As public land is free from tax, this land may be leased probably upon an annual rental of sufficient to cover interest on the investment. Such a fine location and upon such excellent terms the land available will undoubtedly not long need to go begging for occupants. It will probably mean a half dozen or more good sized industries in St. Johns in the very near future.
