### PAYS WELL TO STRAIN HONEY

Department of Agriculture Urges All Bee Keepers to Practice Conservation.

Bee keepers are urged by Kenneth Hawkins, bee specialist of the United States department of agriculture, to produce more honey in the extracted or strained form, instead of as comb honey.

Where honey is extracted from the comb by uncapping cells and whirling the comb in a centrifugal machine, the comb is left intact and can be put back into the hive to be refilled with honey by the bees, saving them the labor of building new comb.

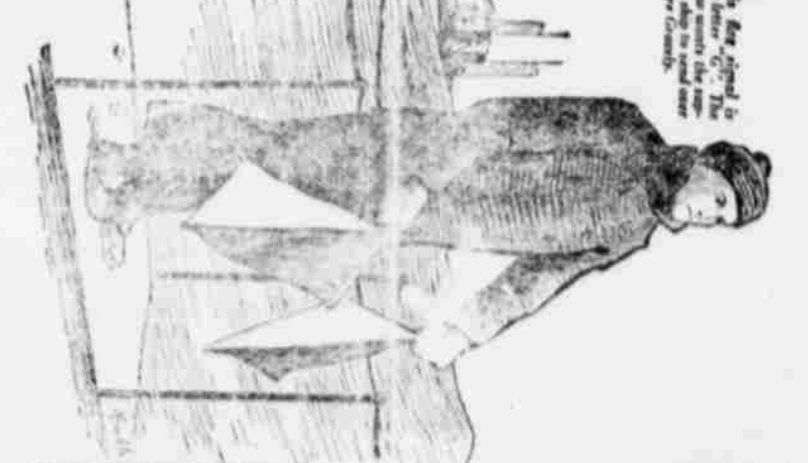
