Immediate construction of a coal storage dock near the municipal elevator at St. Johns was decided upon yesterday at a meeting of the Port of Portland Commission. Costing between \$50,000 and \$75,000, the new dock is expected to save from 25 to 35 cents a ton in loading the coal on ships in the Portland harbor. The new dock, which will be built on property now owned by the Port of Portland, will have a storage capacity of 10,000 tons of coal, it is said. By use of a locomotive crane 50 tons an hour may be loaded, according to present plans. The crane will lift about two tons.
