## Reconstruction in Europe

One of the familiar headlines in religious and other periodicals during the war was, "After the War What?" Now we are in the after the war period and the what? still stares us in the face, and what do we find? We find that human nature, the supreme human need, and the divine provision made for this condition and their needs are the same now after the war as they were before and during the war. We find that men must be born again in order to inherit the Kingdom of God. We find that as always the Bible, given by inspiration of God, is the only and sufficient rule, both of right faith and practice, that the gospel of Christ is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth, and that the divine command still stands to preach this gospel to the whole world. We find that the natural man, the carnal mind is enmity against God, and there is no salvation from sin except by repentance and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. We find that the great facts of life, sin, suffering, sorrow, death, and the great eternal verities written in the Book and graven on the human soul are still the same. We find as before the fact persists that the nations forget God and the course of this world is away from God. After the war, whose rivers of blood poured out, have no atoning, redemptive merit or power, still "the whole creation groeth and travaileth in pain together." Stretching out beseeching hands to the Prince of Peace to come in power and glory and establish His reign of righteousness on the earth.

Directly North of the Caspian Sea, Friends have built two hospitals and last year treated 70,000 out patients. Children by the thousands in this Russian district have lost their parents and are even ignorant of their names.

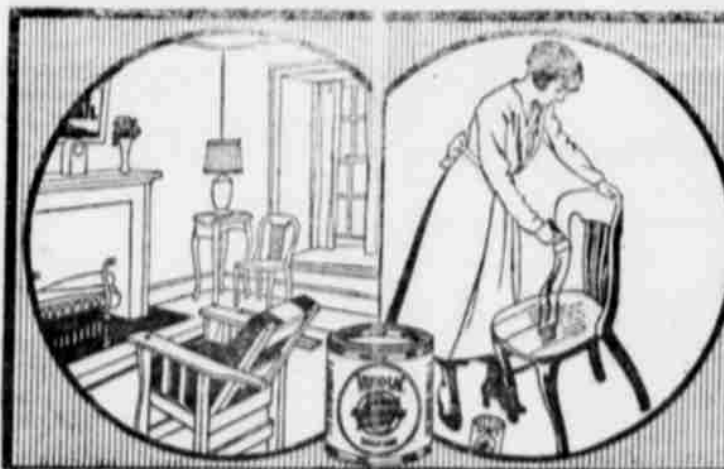
