POINDEXTER'S SERVICE.

The nation owes a large debt to Senator Poindexter for the courageous stand he took when the original covenant of the league of nations was presented to the American public with the curt admonition, "Sign here." The covenant came to this country with all the prestige that the administration these agents could give it by months of official publicity; it came as a sacred document, to be accepted in humility, and any proposal to change it was officially denounced as sacrilegious. Senator Poindexter was one of the few men in public life who was neither overawed by the artificial solemnity thrown around the document nor intimidated by the unreasoned sentiment in favor of it, a sentiment founded largely on popular ignorance of just what the covenant meant. As a result of the fearless and clear analysis of Senator Poindexter and the few other senators who joined with him, the covenant has been radically altered, and public sentiment, once so enthusiastic for the original draft, now recognizes the wisdom of the changes. —Editorial from Seattle Post-Intelligencer.

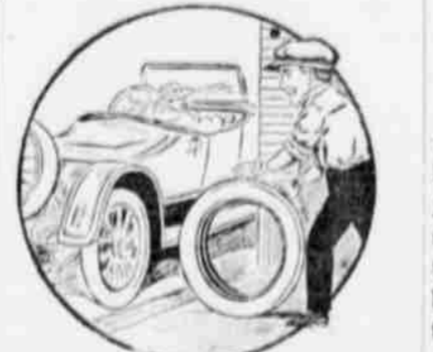
