C. Pacific coast port imported 34,196,857 lbs. of copra last year, from which coconut oil products are made. With creamery combines forcing butter to near the dollar mark, vegetable oils and substitutes for fats are important. But congress and legislative impose taxes on the substitutes in the interest of the creamery trust and prohibit sales. Copra is used to manufacture a product marketed all over the country. The Legislatures penalize this by the enactment of laws that practically prohibit selling white coconut butter. Thus, in trying to slam the big packers, the legislature, as it usually does in such cases, really injured a western industry and as a result of this legislative asinine may lose its principal return cargoes from the orient, a matter of grave importance to all producers, as few ships will come here if they have no cargo to bring. Then we talk about encouraging Pacific coast shipping and cutting down the high cost of living.—Pacific Coast Manufacturer.

The fruit industry in Oregon and Washington has at last been put on a stable basis through the development of fruit juice, preserving, canning and other packing industries which assure a ready market for the growers products. As usual it took individual initiative and enterprise to bring this about. The pioneers in the fruit juice industry in the northwest had courage to spend money advertising loganberry and apple juice.
